BOARD ACTION

FY2009 Operating Budget Including Tuition and Fees

BACKGROUND

The FY2008 operating budget was presented to and approved by the Board of Trustees during the June 2007 meeting. At that time, a brief FY2009 operating budget outlook was also presented to the Board. Over the summer and fall, colleges and universities developed their FY2009 budgets for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2008.

The purpose of this report is to present the System financial outlook for FY2009 along with the college and university operating budgets and tuition requests for FY2009. This report is organized into the sections outlined below with corresponding attachments.

Supplemental packet – Contains all student consultation letters. Institution profile information for each college and university was included in the January 2008 materials presented to the Board of Trustees.

The Chancellor's recommendations for the colleges and universities FY2009 operating budgets, including tuition and fees, is being presented in this report for consideration by the committee. The Board will be asked to adopt the budget at the March 2008 Board of Trustees meeting.

I. System Budget Overview

Planning for the System budget began earlier this year at the time the FY2008 budget was being developed. The Board expressed, during its June 2007, meeting its desire to limit tuition increases in FY2009 to 2 percent at colleges and 3 percent at universities. The cost would be approximately \$9.4 million, \$6.5 million for colleges and \$2.9 million for universities. Discussions continued into the fall and the Board's direction to limit tuition increases has been incorporated into the FY2009 operating budgets. The limit in tuition increases is revenue neutral for colleges and universities due to the redirection of base initiative funds from the System.

The System's state appropriation for FY2009 is \$689.3 million, an increase of \$22.4 million (3.4 percent) over FY2008. The appropriation is allocated within the areas of the allocation framework: institution allocations, priority allocation, and system wide set asides. For FY2009, 87 percent of the state funds (including interest earnings) received by the System are allocated to colleges and universities either as basic allocations or through priority allocations. (Table 1) Every effort is made to direct the maximum possible portion of the state funds to the institution basic allocations to provide the most flexible support to all colleges and universities. The basic allocations are increasing \$18.2 million or 3.4 percent.

Allocations

Of the \$559.4 million for institution basic allocations, \$548.2 million is distributed through the allocation framework with the balance distributed in support of contract/non credit instruction and PALS (project for automated library services). In summary, the colleges and universities will receive 50 percent of their allocation based on their prior year base and 50 percent on the results of the allocation framework, with any inflation funds being distributed on their prior year base. As in past years, a bridge transition program is in place to ensure that no college or

university falls below their FY2007 level of funding if in the first year of transition. The bridge transition program would be at decreasing levels over four years so that an institution in the first year of the program would receive 100 percent of bridge amount, second year 75 percent, third year 50 percent, and fourth year 25 percent.

The \$47.5 million in priority allocations are incentive and performance funds that are used to drive compelling educational interests. These priorities can be determined by the legislature, Board or Chancellor. Some of the priority areas include: revenue replacement for the limit in tuition increases; support of the underserved/underrepresented activities; technology investments; non-resident tuition buy-down; support of the centers of excellence; tuition subsidies for management programs, fire fighter training, the Alliss program; MnOnline support; sign language interpreter services; and competitive salaries. The \$47.5 million includes an increase in the portion of the FY2009 enterprise technology allocation directed to colleges and universities. As campus needs for increased technology funding continue to grow, the Chancellor is proposing to increase the institutional funding from the enterprise technology budget by 50 percent, from \$5.0 million to \$7.5 million. This increased funding should have a positive effect on the overall progress in implementing the Enterprise Technology Strategic Investment Plan, as most of the enterprise projects are dependent on a robust campus information technology infrastructure in addition to the enterprise infrastructure in order to achieve success. Also included in the priority allocations is the redirection of the \$9.4 million of base initiatives funds to support revenue replacement for the limit of tuition increases.

State funds support system wide programs and the budget for the Office of the Chancellor/Shared Services Division. The system wide programs supported by the \$44.8 million include such areas as attorney general services, debt service, presidential searches, repair and replacement, system audit program, and enterprise technology. The budget of the Office of the Chancellor/Shared Services Division receives \$43.5 million in state support.

The Chancellor is recommending modifying budgeting and allocation methods in order to reflect the cost of presidential compensation at the system level rather than as a component of college and university budgets. Presidential compensation includes salary and fringe benefits as well as housing and transportation allowances. Campus allocations will be reduced in order to move the expense to the Chancellor's budget. Future changes in presidential compensation will be funded as a system wide expense.

Board Initiatives

The Board's strategic and action plans were the basis for development of the FY2008-2009 biennial operating budget. Funds were provided in the higher education bill for technology and recruitment/retention of underserved and underrepresented students. In FY2008 the \$7.5 million for Board initiatives and \$1.5 million for the Chancellor's initiatives were directed to help advance priorities of the Board. The Academic and Student Affairs division was allocated \$5.5 million to support statewide health sciences initiatives, college readiness, retention, transition assistance, and targeted curriculum development. An additional \$3.0 million was distributed across the balance of the Office of the Chancellor units in support of various efforts. At the Board's direction, the \$9.0 million of base initiative funds will be reprogrammed in order to support limiting tuition increases to 2 percent for colleges and 3 percent for universities. In

FY2009 initiatives will be funded from the extraordinary interest earnings that are one-time in nature. Discussion concerning system wide priorities for FY2009 will commence this spring and will be presented to the Board in early summer.

Recruitment and retention of students from groups traditionally underrepresented in higher education: \$11.0 million FY2009

The Chancellor is recommending continuing in FY2009 the innovative and comprehensive program to help prepare students for college, encourage their enrollment and provide services that enable them to successfully attain their education goals by allocating \$11.0 million. Approximately one-third of these funds, or \$3.4 million, is recommended to continue funding for three higher education access and opportunity centers that are currently beginning their first year of operation. These centers will provide college awareness and readiness services for underrepresented students in grades 8-12 and will also provide professional development services to the students' teachers to help them better reach these students. The centers will develop creative and innovative new ways to work with underrepresented students, as well as refine existing interventions to make them more effective. Two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) will be used by the Public Relations division and the Diversity and Multicultural Services division for outreach efforts, publications aimed at underrepresented students, and other services. The remaining \$7.4 million is recommended to be provided on a formula basis, as was done in the current year, for colleges and universities to continue programs they have begun to increase the participation of underrepresented students in higher education, and to provide services that will enable these students to be retained in the colleges and universities they choose to attend.

Information Technology: \$33.7 million FY2009

The Chancellor is recommending allocating \$33.7 million of state resources for FY2009 to fund base administrative and academic information systems infrastructure. This funding will support projects in the eight key areas contained in the Enterprise Technology Strategic Plan approved by the Board in March 2006. The key areas are: network and data center modernization; security management; identity management; retooled administrative systems; new technology architecture; student services and online learning; faculty research and development; and career, business and entrepreneurship. It is proposed that \$7.5 million be distributed directly to colleges and universities for specific improvements and enhancements to local campus information systems infrastructure and security.

The biennial budget plan approved by the Board in the fall of 2006 included over \$22 million of planned reallocations as part of the FY2008-2009 budget plan. Recently a report was submitted to the Legislature which contained reallocation information. The reported detailed \$22.9 million of reallocations for FY2008 by the colleges and universities and the Office of the Chancellor. Colleges and universities and the Office of the Chancellor identified activities or services that were reduced in order to provide resources for other uses. Some of the areas identified were suspension/closure of academic programs and reductions in faculty, staff and administrative positions, equipment, repair and replacement, and other operating areas. Some of the areas where investments were made include academic program expansion (including new, redesigned,

and enhanced programs, and online offerings), strategic initiatives, safety and security, marketing/recruitment, veterans' centers, and facility improvements.

II. College and University Operating Budgets

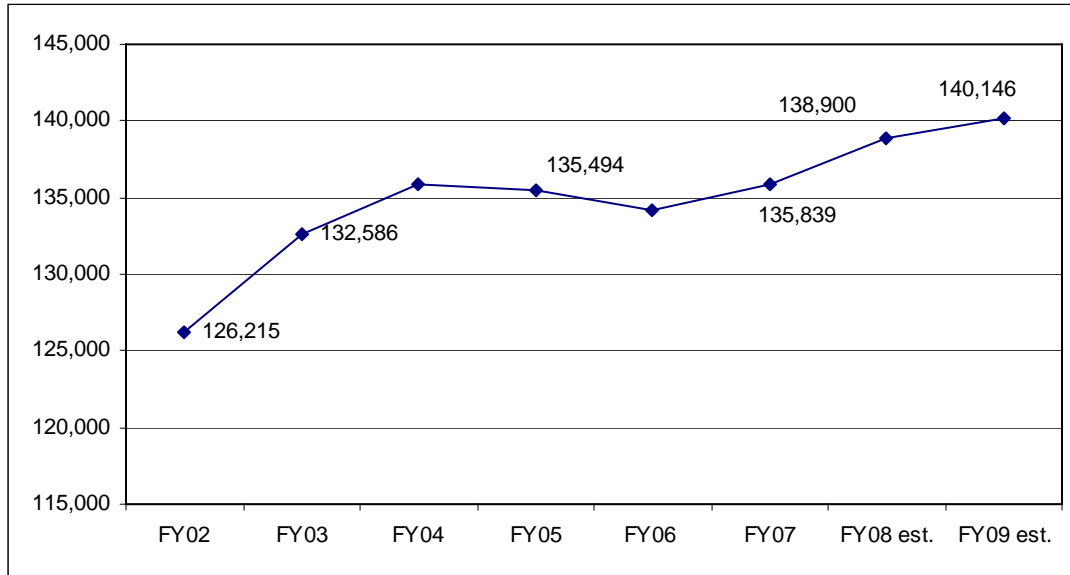
The colleges and universities began their FY2009 budget planning and consultation process with campus constituents within the parameters of a tuition increase not exceeding 4 percent. The Board's direction of limiting tuition increases to 2 percent at colleges and 3 percent at universities has been incorporated into campus planning and consultation. The college and university operating budgets reflect the tuition limit and include revenue replacement from the System totaling \$9.4 million. The colleges and universities also incorporated the state Department of Finance's wage inflationary guideline of 3.25 percent and a 2 percent increase for other operating costs in FY2009 in the operating budget planning parameters. Chief financial officers may have also provided for additional total compensation cost inflation because of local circumstances and state-wide settlements exceeding the planning estimates. The annual budgets presented in this report are on a budgetary (cash) basis which differs from the accrual presentation shown in the FY2007 audited financial statements. The annual budgets are based on anticipated revenues and expenses received or paid during the fiscal year versus the accrual method that recognizes revenues when earned and expenses when occurred regardless of the timing of related cash flows.

Enrollment

The enrollment at the colleges and universities has grown from 126,215 full-year equivalent (FYE) students in FY2002 to 135,839 FYE in FY2007 – an increase of 9,624 or 7.6 percent. (Graph A) The enrollment is projected to increase this biennium at a rate of 2.3 percent in FY2008 and 0.9 percent in FY2009.

All Funds Proposed Budget

Colleges and universities have three principal sources of revenue: state appropriation, tuition and fees, and auxiliary/enterprise. These revenues support all aspects of the educational enterprise – instruction, student life, administration, physical plant, and the residential life programs. In addition, the colleges and universities have a practice of maintaining a budgetary fund balance that can be used as part of a budget strategy from one year to the next. The budgetary fund balances are the result of revenues received and expenses paid within the prior fiscal year and represent the available cash at the close of the fiscal year.

The System’s FY2009 all funds budget is showing a positive balance after appropriation, tuition and fee revenue increases, expense reductions, and the use of fund balance. (Table 2) The \$2.0 billion budget includes an estimated \$244 million of financial aid revenue and expense. Approximately 87% of financial aid revenue (\$212 million) is brought in to pay student obligations (tuition, fees, room and board, and sales and services) with the balance (\$32 million) reflecting the net financial aid expense. Budgeting financial aid results in all funds revenue and expenses being overstated by approximately \$212 million.

General Fund Proposed Budget

Table 3 outlines the general fund revenues and expenses for FY2008-2009. The System's FY2009 general fund budget is showing a small positive balance. Colleges and universities submitted budget plans which included the use of \$31.9 million of fund balances, approximately 2 percent of total FY2009 revenues. The colleges and universities use a variety of strategies to balance their budgets that include, but are not limited to, personnel reductions, equipment and supplies reductions, redesigning or eliminating programs, improving administrative efficiencies, tuition rate increases, and the use of fund balance. Campus administrators are committed to providing resources in support of the goals of the Board and the Chancellor.

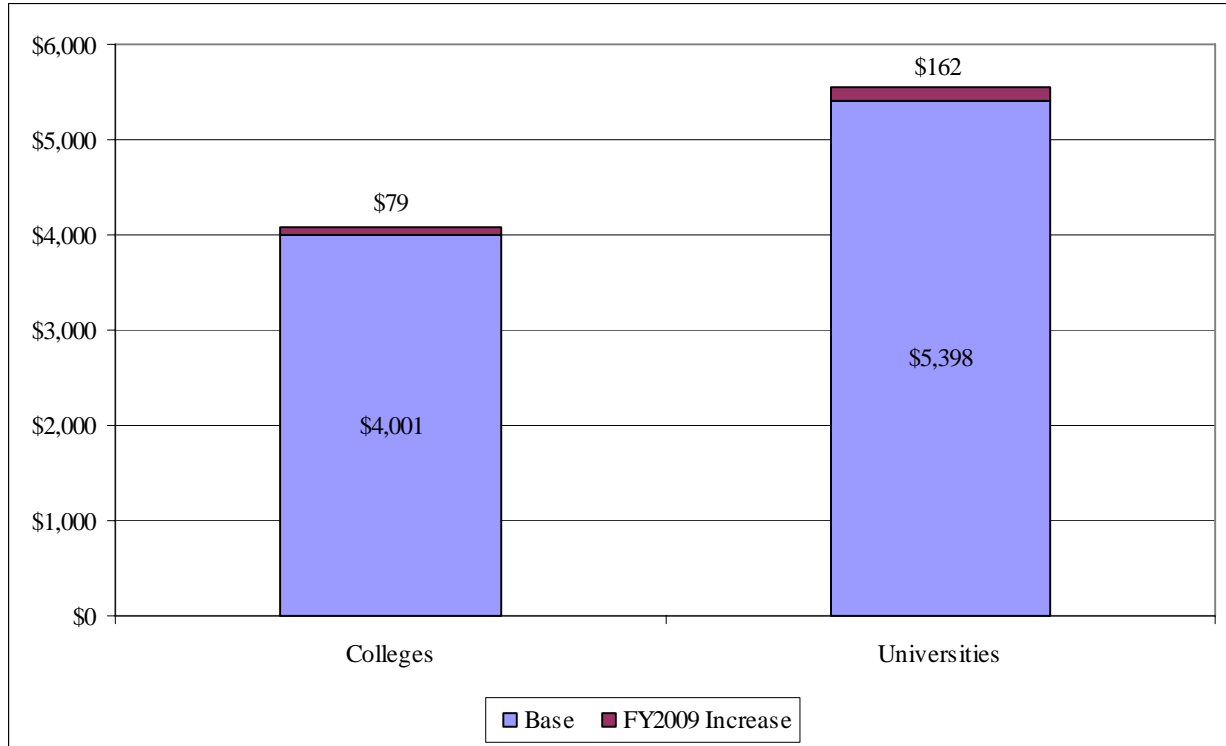

Tuition

Colleges and universities have been discussing their FY2009 operating budget including tuition and fees with campus constituents for the past several months. The impact for a FYE student of the recommended tuition changes is illustrated in Graph B. For colleges, the average tuition for a FYE student in FY2008 was \$4,001 and are proposing an average annual increase of \$79 (2 percent) for FY2009. For universities, the average tuition for a FYE student in FY2008 was \$5,398 and are proposing an average increase of \$162 (3 percent) for FY2009. Overall, the system average annual tuition increase proposed for FY2009 is \$95 per FYE student or 2.2 percent resulting in the system's average undergraduate tuition rate of \$4,360.

Attachments 1A through 1E provide the detail to the tuition rate changes proposed in FY2009 for per credit resident undergraduate, undergraduate banded rate, resident graduate (includes masters and doctoral), undergraduate program and course rates, and non-resident, non reciprocity rates.

Student Fees

General fees

The fee data reported includes technology, athletics, health services, student activity/life, and parking. The largest increase in fee rates for FY2009 is occurring within technology, followed by health services and athletics. The detail to fee rates can be found in the supplemental packet. The fee increases have been negotiated with the campus student associations and are necessary to meet local objectives. The revenue generated from the technology fee directly supports technology that provides or enhances student access to technology. Colleges and universities are faced with increased demand for technical support in the classrooms and general computer labs as well as the need to update networks, computers, software, and peripheral equipment. Some of the student consultation letters mentioned the technology fee increase and noted that students

understood the need for and cost of upgrading and adding technology. The average annual increase in fee rates for FY2009 is \$36. When combined with the proposed tuition increase of \$95 (2.2 percent), the fee increase results in an additional 0.6 percent increase. The total tuition and fee increase for a FYE student would be \$131 or 2.8 percent.

Requests have been made to increase two fee maximums. (Attachment 2) The first request is to increase the athletics fee from a maximum of \$50 per semester to \$55 per semester. The increase in this fee would allow universities to better meet the current needs of athletics including additional liability insurance costs. The second request is to increase the health services fee from a maximum of \$60 per semester to \$65 per semester. The additional revenue would allow colleges and universities to either maintain current level of services or expand services to better meet demand. Discussions regarding fee rates are still occurring at some colleges and universities and will be finalized later this spring.

Revenue Fund Fees

Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 136F.93 and the Master Indenture governing the Revenue Fund require annual approval of the fees for housing, contract dining, and student union facilities by the Board of Trustees. The proposed fees are incorporated into the Revenue Fund finance plan and the all funds budget presented in Table 2. A finance plan for the Revenue Fund is included in the supplemental packet.

Room and Board Fees. The universities provided a set of proposed rates for FY 2009 which also includes financing for major repairs, renewal, and new construction. (Attachment 3A) The fee increases for a base double room range from a high of 7 percent at Minnesota State University, Mankato to a low of 1 percent at Bemidji State University. Each university has many different room types. The fees for the differing room types do not always increase at identical rates, usually for marketing reasons. In addition to the base room fee and the base board fee, there is a line item for "Other Room Fees" which includes supplementary fees such as phones, cable television, and hall social fees. The "Other Board Fees" are mandatory flex dollars required as part of the board plan that students can use as cash to eat in retail food operations on campus.

Student Union Facilities Fees. The facility fee supports the basic operation of the student unions, including core operations that relate to the building, but not the actual programs offered in the building. Examples of core operations are a director and supporting staff, custodial and maintenance staff and associated equipment, supplies, and other expenses such as debt service, insurance, and repair and replacement. The programming provided through the student unions is supported by the activity fee on each campus and is not part of the Revenue Fund. Examples of items covered by the activity fee are student government, student clubs and organizations, recreation and club sports.

Facility fees are charged on a per credit hour basis and vary by university. Attachment 3B describes the specific assessments. For FY2009, the recommended fees range from \$146.88 at St. Cloud State University to \$279.60 at Southwest Minnesota State University.

Parking Ramp Fees. The parking ramp located at Minneapolis Community and Technical College transferred into the Revenue Fund under the authority of Metropolitan State University in January 2003, and so these fees must be approved by the Board. There is no change in the Metropolitan State University parking fees for FY2009. St. Cloud State University is in the process of constructing a parking ramp financed in part with Revenue Fund bond proceeds that will open in FY2009, and the fees must be approved by the Board. The proposed FY2009 parking ramp fees for Metropolitan State University and St. Cloud State University can be found in Attachment 3C,

Wellness Facility Fees. The Wellness Center at Minnesota State University Moorhead, funded with both Revenue Fund bond proceeds and private contributions is under construction and scheduled to open in the fall of 2008. Minnesota State University Moorhead is requesting to increase the wellness fee in FY2009 from \$150.00 per academic year to \$160.00. The students have agreed to the proposed increase.

The Wellness Center at Winona State University, currently a FY2008 capital project and part of the proposed 2008 Revenue Fund bond sale, is requesting to increase the wellness fee in FY2009 from \$21.00 per academic year to \$141.00.

Minnesota State University, Mankato is planning improvements in the Outdoor Campus Recreation Facilities and will use Revenue Bond proceeds from the 2009 sale. The university is proposing an outdoor recreation fee in the amount of \$60.00 per academic year beginning in FY2009 to pay for the debt service. The students support the proposed fee.

The wellness facility fees detail can be found in Attachment 3D.

Student Consultation Process

Colleges and universities have been discussing the FY2009 budget with campus constituents for several months. To allow for thorough discussion between students and administration, the deadline for student consultation letters was moved to late February.

The FY2009 Operating Budget Including Tuition and Fees' supplemental packet includes student consultation letters from each college and university. Also included in the packet is a document that summarizes the student consultation letters. Overall, the students are satisfied that the consultation process went well and that their administrators are working hard to include them in the decision-making process. They were given sufficient information along with sufficient time to discuss the issues thoroughly and ask questions.

Most of the letters were in support of the administration's recommended increase, and students expressed appreciation for efforts to keep tuition affordable. The students again expressed a desire for an increased appropriation request that includes tuition relief.

Reserves

Board policy calls for college and university reserves of 5 to 7 percent of revenue. Reserves are one of the important tools colleges and universities can use to respond to financial difficulties.

Each college and university must respond to local budgetary demands and use reserves accordingly. Colleges and universities have been gradually building reserves in order to attain the 5 to 7 percent per Board policy. (Table 4) Board policy also allows for a system wide reserve not to exceed 2 percent of the annual state appropriation. Currently, the system wide reserve is \$7.9 million, 1.2 percent of the System's \$666.9 million of state appropriation.

III. RECOMMENDED COMMITTEE ACTION:

The Finance, Facilities and Technology Policy Committee recommends that the Board of Trustees adopt the following motion:

RECOMMENDED MOTION:

1. Adopt the annual total operating budget and general fund budget for FY2009 in Tables 2 and 3. Per Board Policy 5.9, the Board will be periodically provided system wide budget updates for all funding sources on an exception reporting basis.

2. Approve the proposed tuition structure recommendations for FY2009 as detailed in Attachments 1A through 1E. The percentage impact of resident tuition rates represents the maximum amount that can be applied to other tuition rates charged by the college or university not impacted by reciprocity agreements such as nonresident and off campus rates.

The tuition increase is effective Summer Session or Fall Semester, 2008 at the discretion of the president. The chancellor is authorized to approve tuition structures for new courses or programs proposed after this date, as well as any required technical adjustments, and is requested to incorporate any approvals at the time FY2010 tuition recommendation is presented to the Board. The Board continues the policy of market-driven tuition for closed enrollment courses, customized training, non-credit instruction, continuing education, distance learning and contract postsecondary enrollment option programs.

3. Approve the increases in fee maximums for athletics and health services as detailed in Attachment 2.

4. Approve the Revenue Fund FY2009 fees for room and board and student union, wellness and parking facilities, as detailed in Attachments 3A through 3D.
